Stitch Scale Set E for Studio, Singer, Knitmaster, Empisal and Silver Reed KR7 Knit Contours.

These stitch scales were originally sold with the LK 100 plastic bed machine, but they work in the KR7 as well. They are half-scale, with 0 on the left. This makes it possible to use half-scale patterns with the center line on the left side of the paper, instead of in the middle.

The scales are meant to be used on midgauge and bulky machines, and they go from 9 sts per 10 cm/4" through 26 sts per 10 cm/4". Standard machines would need to use yarn that would normally knit at approximately T9 with these scales.

Scales are 34.5 cm/ 13 7/16 inch long. They are shown on US legal size paper, which is $8 \frac{1}{2} \times 14$ inches. Some home printers are not able to print so close to the edge, and it may be necessary to take the file to a commercial copy center. Do a test run to be sure the printed scales actually measure 13.5 cm. Usually there is a printer setting that allows printing at 100%. Do not use "fit to page" or any scaling, since this can reduce the size of the scale.

Use heavy paper if possible. These scales must go under clips on each side of the paper slot, and inexpensive, lightweight copier paper may tear or crumple. If you never use legal size paper, it might actually cost less to print these at a copy shop, instead of purchasing a package of legal size paper.
